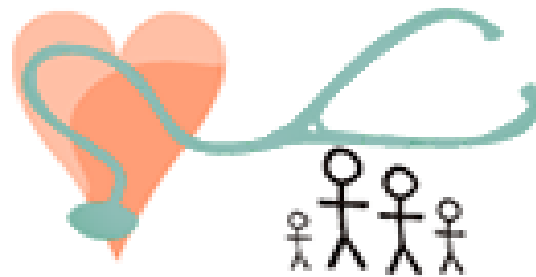

Oakwood Terrace Statistics

Data continues to suggest that health equity and quality of life is adversely affected by food insecurities and access to food. The residents of Oakwood Terrace have a greater chance of becoming ill because of where they live (food desert, high crime, lack of transportation), social and economic situations, as well behaviors that can cause health problems. **The following local statistics support this community initiative:**

- ▶ *Community Served by Weis includes 32505 and small portion of 32501 zip codes:*
- ▶ 32% of households live in poverty - median household income is \$22,179
- ▶ 82% of children receive SNAP assistance
- ▶ Highest level of child abuse and neglect reports (4,598) 47%
- ▶ Arrests (2014) Adults: 15,826; Youth: 1,425
- ▶ Highest rate of United Way 211 request for Utility Assistance, Housing Assistance, Food
- ▶ Highest rate of pediatric ER visits (5,000)
- ▶ Oakwood Terrace has been identified as a high impact area of services. Oakwood Terrace is a two-story low income housing project built in 1974 with has (300) units. Of the nearly (600) students attending C.A. Weis Elementary, A Community School, approximately (200) students reside in Oakwood Terrace.
